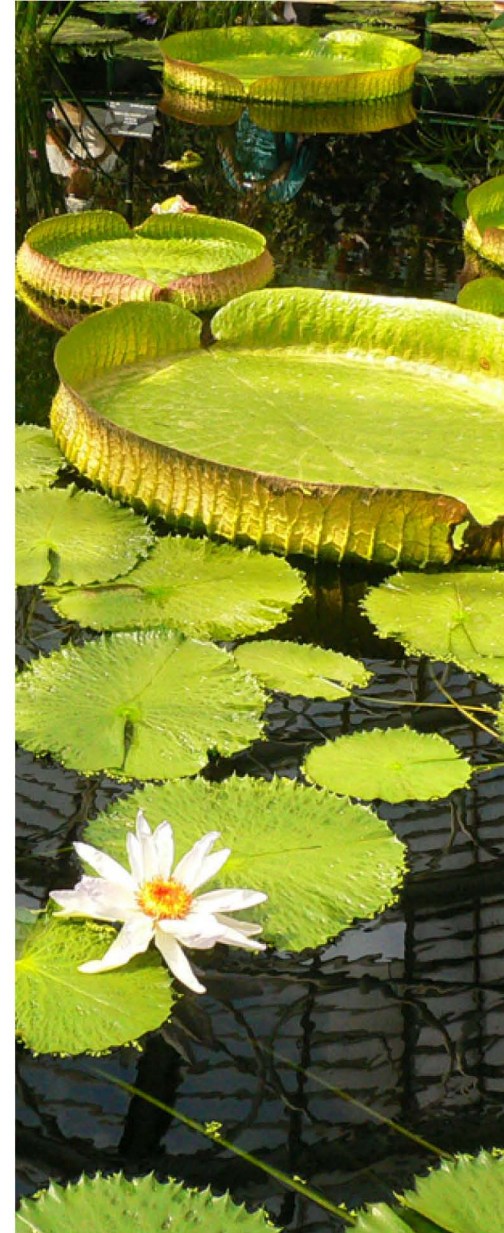
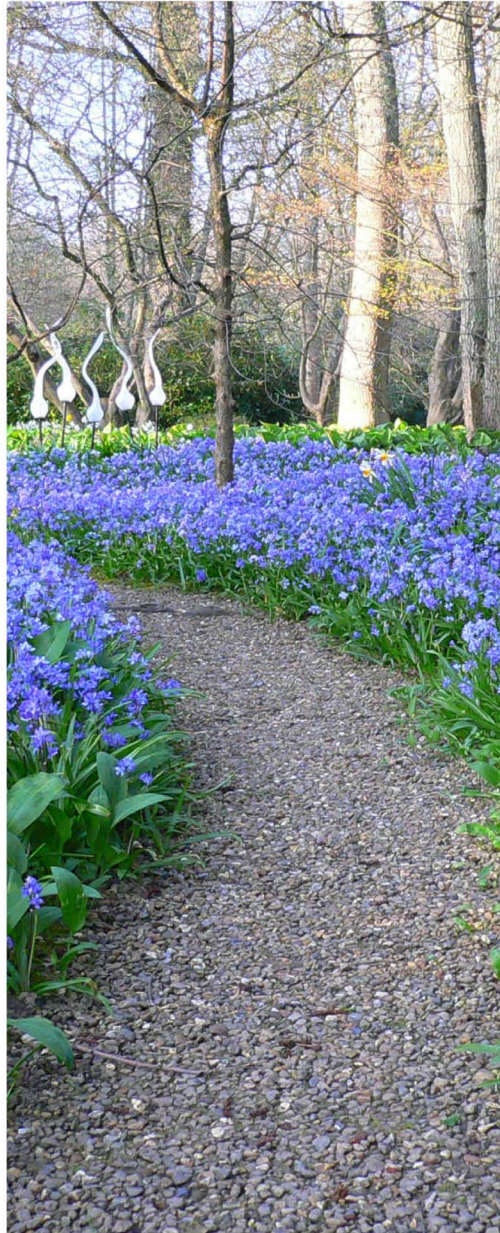

**1.1 Old governors house, Jersey**

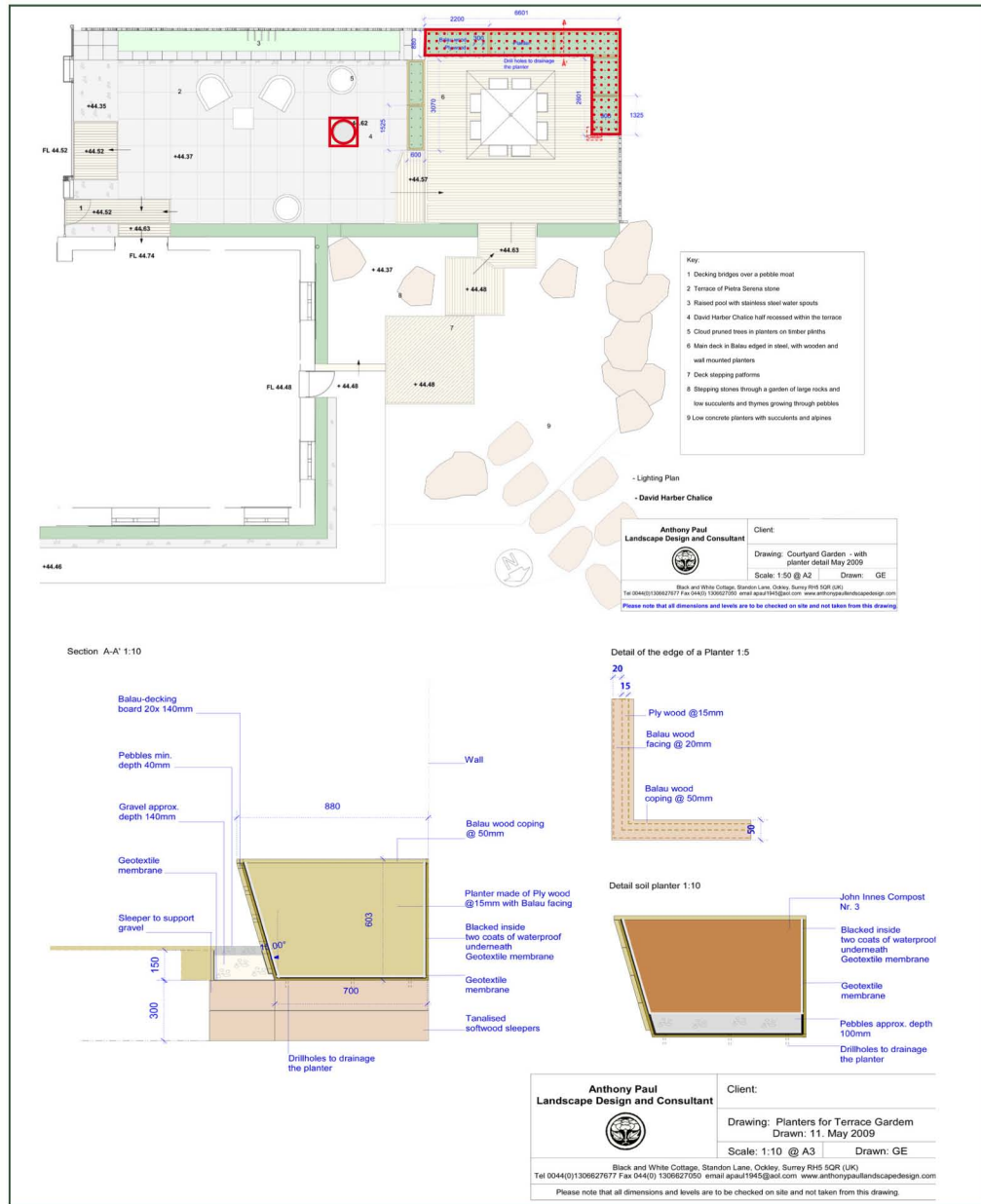
**Situation**

This recently renovated house situated on the cliff top needed to have its garden remodelled.

**Project**

In contrast to the style of the renovated historical house, we installed two contemporary water features providing a relaxing ambient to the courtyard. Flowerbeds incorporating cliff stone and decking structures were used to harmonise with the natural settings. These are accessible by a path bordered with decorative flowers leading towards the cliff.

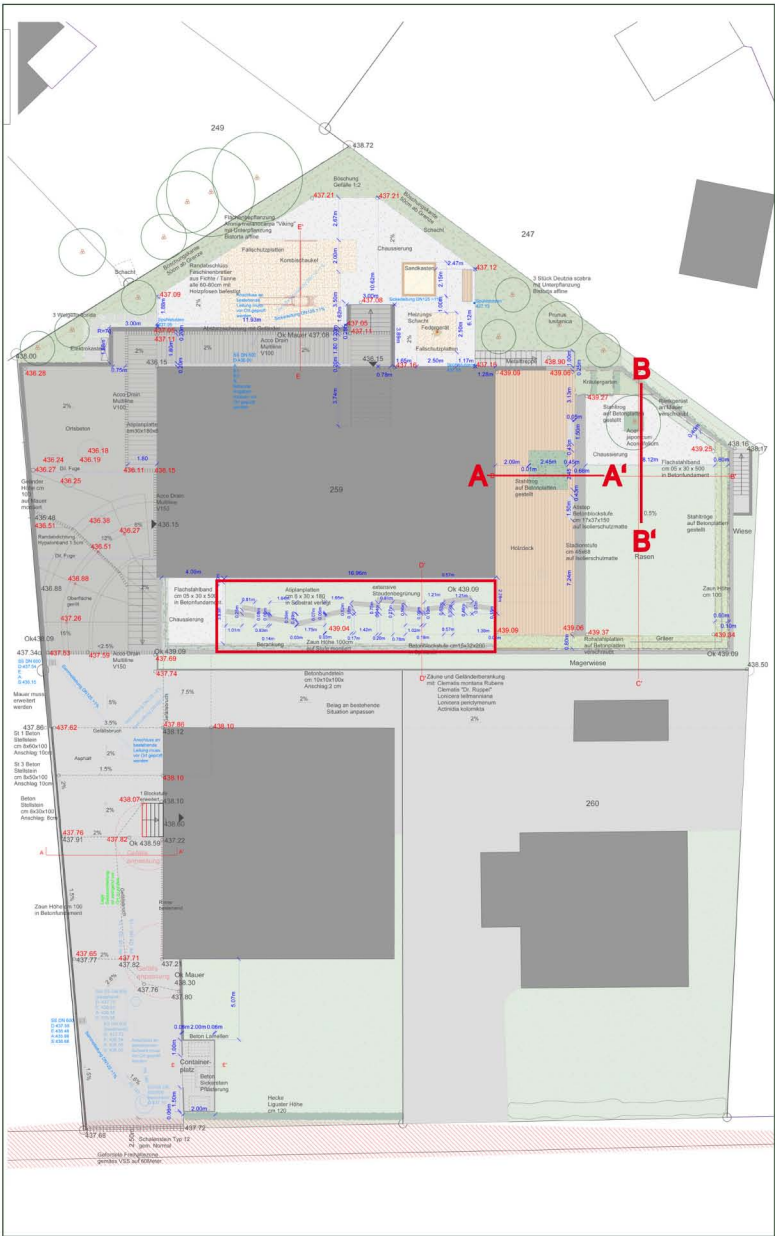
#### Situation

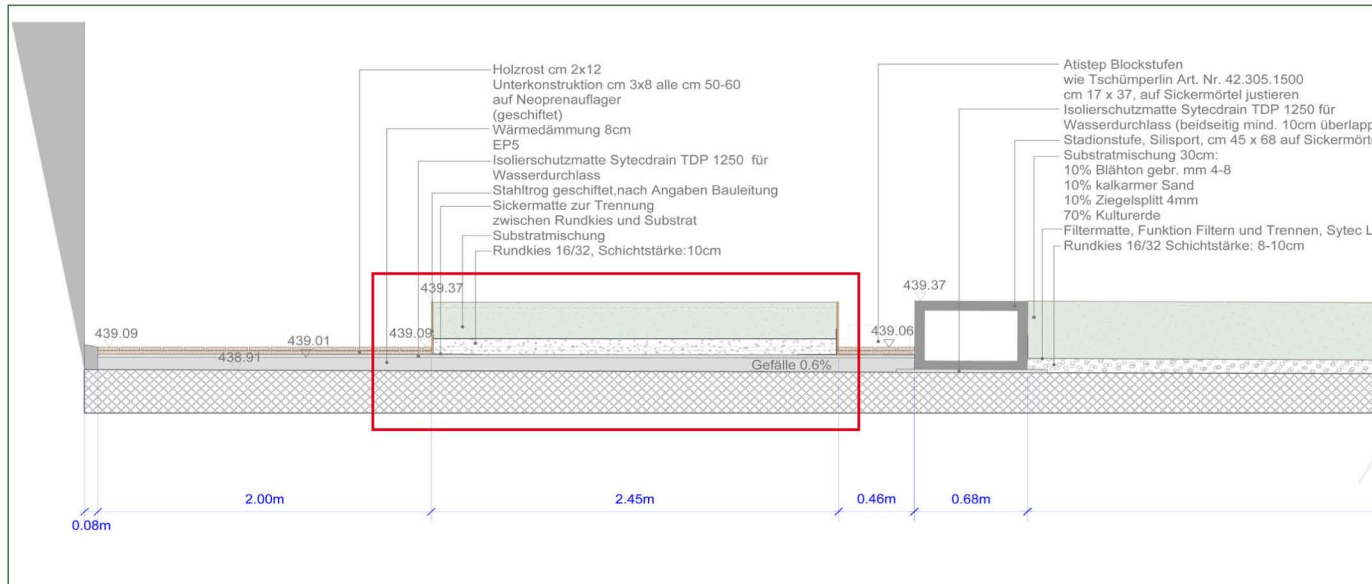
The environment of a modern housing complex B was designed in collaboration of several owners and designers. Our responsibility was the creative and technical planning and design of the whole environment with focus on the roof-top garden.

#### Project

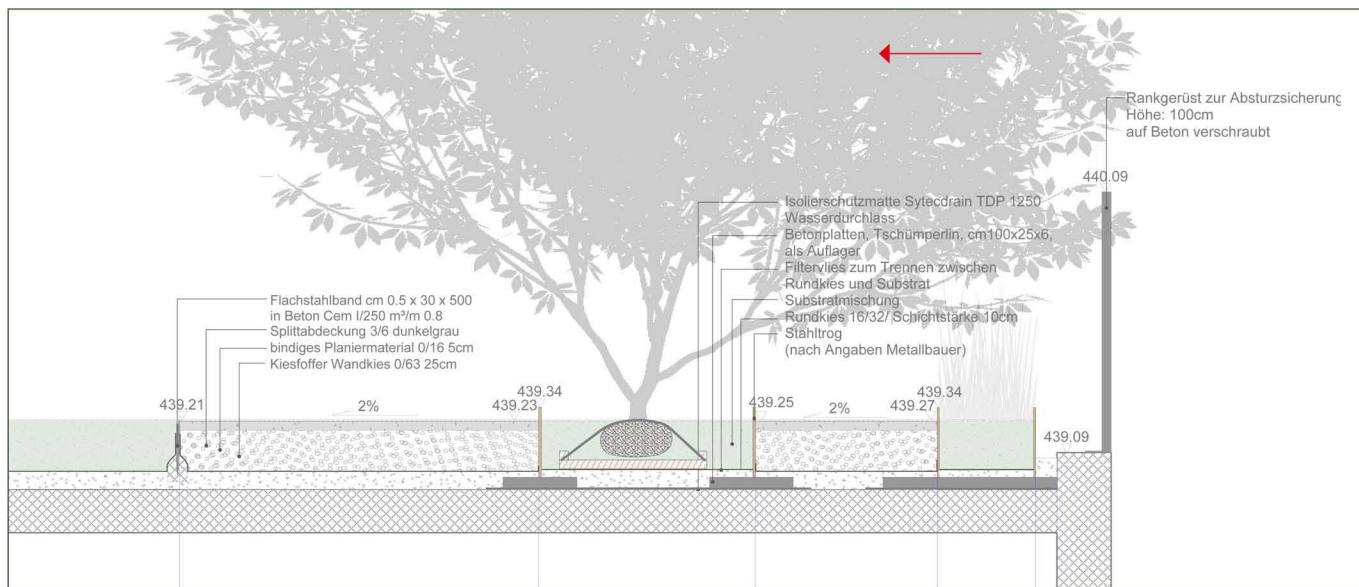
The spacious terrace above the garage is separated in an intensive and extensive green roof-top garden. In line with the modern architecture of the building, contemporary architectural shapes using modern materials were incorporated in the design of the terrace.

The plantation of the terrace, using “Miscanthus“, japanese Acer and extensive flowers, highlights the contemporary concept. We also incorporated romantic elements like a trellis of grapes plants.

## 2.2 Lido, Lachen, Switzerland

Giving a brush up to one of the most scenic Lidos in Switzerland at the Lake of Thun in Berne

### Situation

An old and neglected lido in Lachen, Thun, was renovated in collaboration with a swimming pool design team. Our responsibility was the planning and design of the environment of the swimming pools.

### Project

In adaption to the element water, the visual focus was put on two main elements, a slatted wooden panel and seat element. The wooden panel finishing hides the concrete wall and the seat element decreases the difference in height of the swimming and wading pool. Spacious wooden decks and benches invite visitors to rest and the minimalistic plantation including Cortaderias and Lavender, clean up the heterogenic impression.

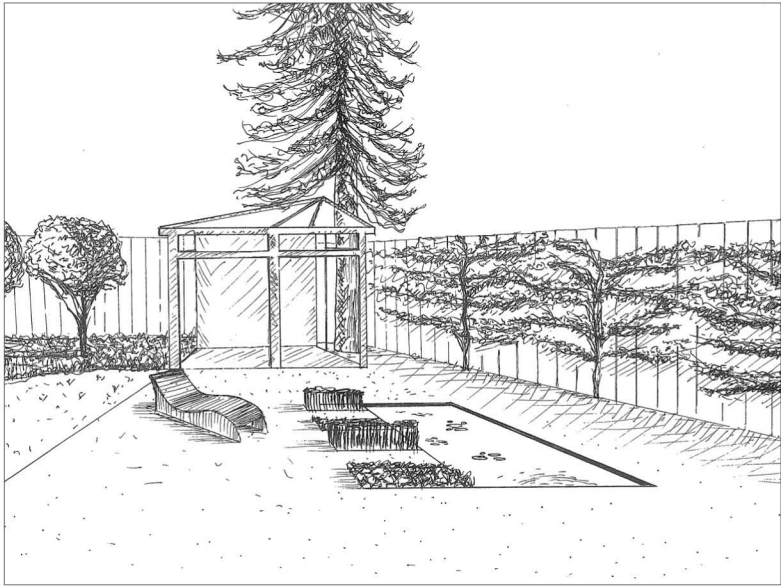
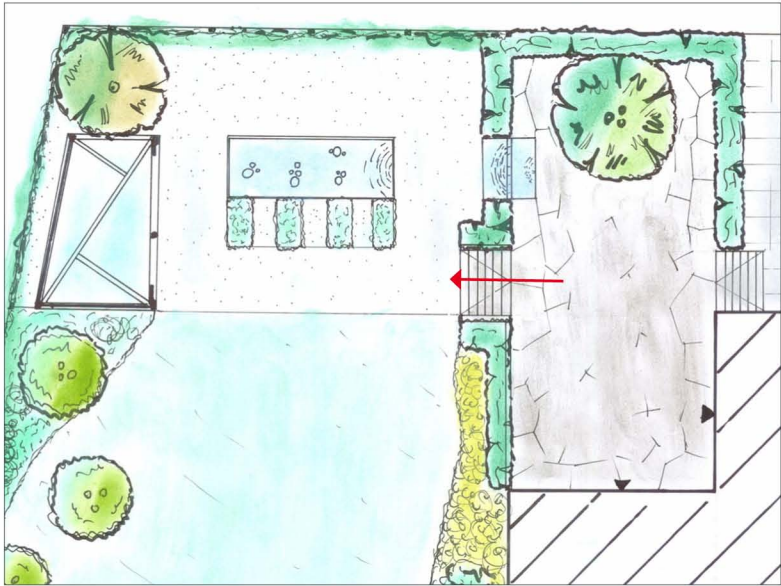
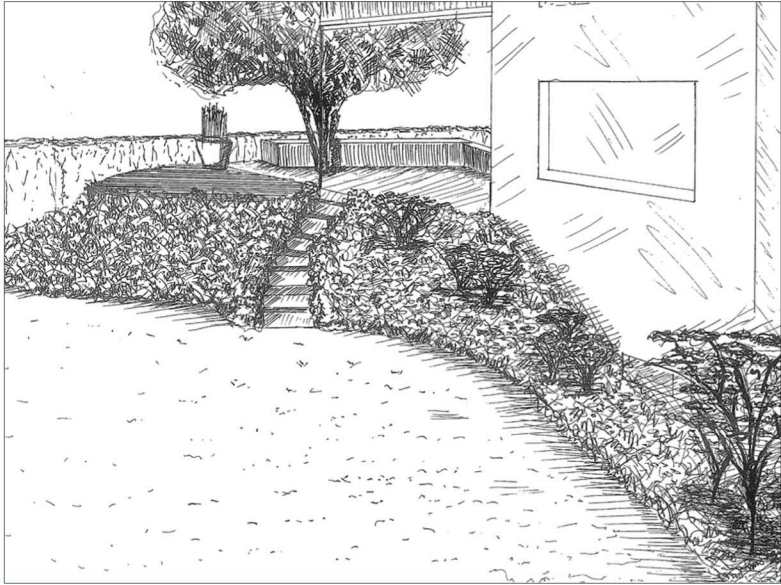
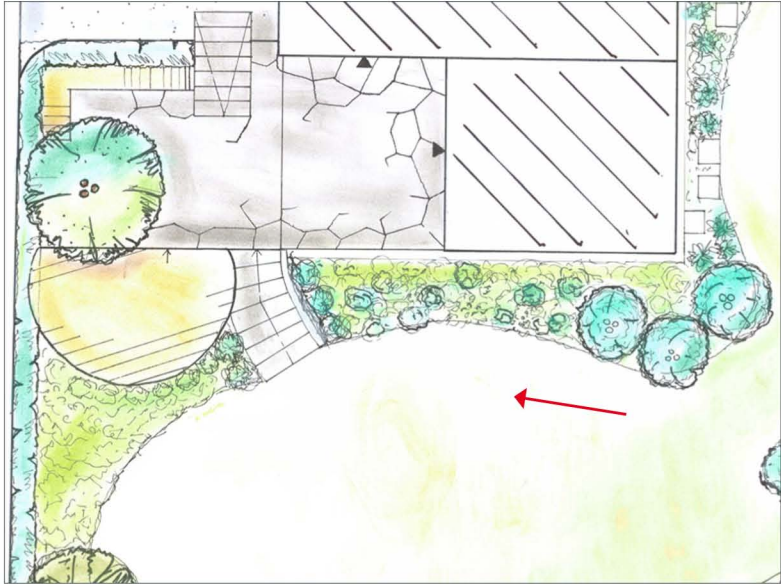
A new floral garden for an old urban house in the city of Zug

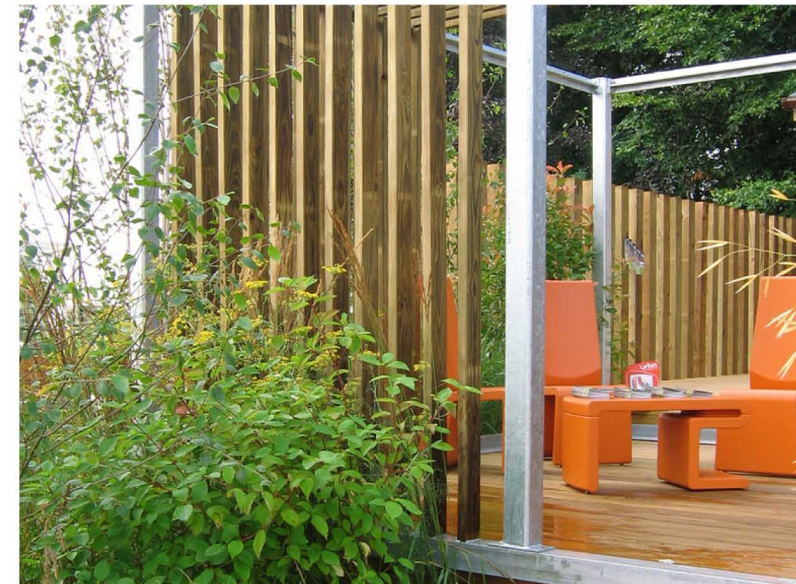
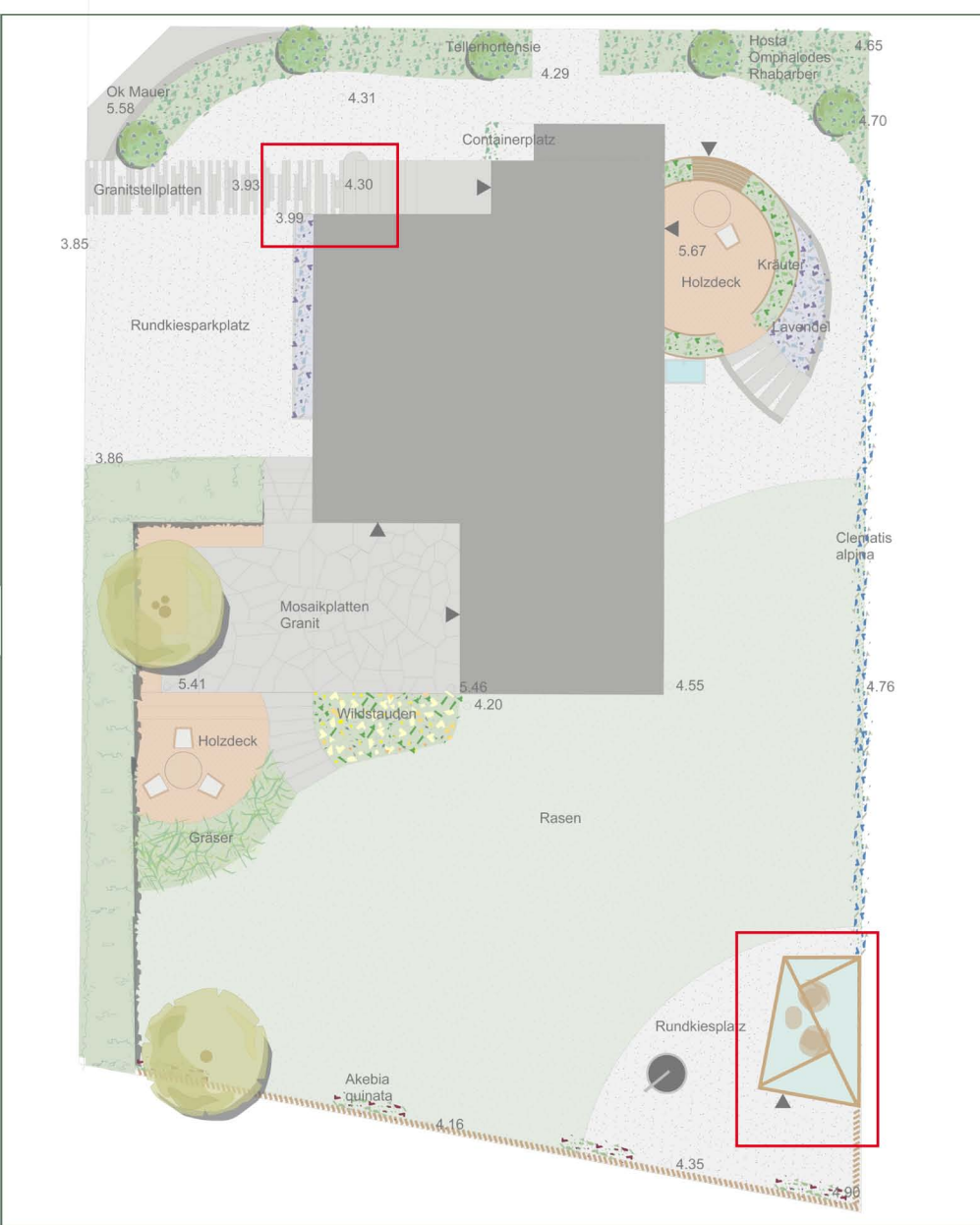
#### Situation

Due to progressing urbanization a small single housing unit was being surrounded more and more by multi story buildings. To restrict the view of the surrounding buildings a solution and suggestions for the structuring of the garden were requested.

#### Project

After several different conceptual suggestions, the owner chose a floral solution, where the playground lawn was going to be left almost untouched. The construction was decided to proceed in phases, where in the first phase the focus was set on the view restriction into the living room.







**3 Garden projects in the City and the suburban sprout of Zurich, Switzerland**

**3.1 Farmhouse J.**

Giving more privacy to the old farmhouse through restricting views of overlooking houses.

**Situation**

The old farmhouse despite having an orchard and surrounding fields also had overlooking houses to the south and west. This view needed to be restricted.

**Realisation**

To the south and adjoining the orchard, I planted two rows of apple trees. Which upon maturity would impeded the view and provide an alley feature.

The solution to the west was solved using a wood and metal framework incorporating various climbing wall plants.





### 3.2 Garden Z

A replantation of an old courtyard

**Situation**  
The Garden Z, despite being well structured was overgrown, neglected and in need of attention.

**Realisation**  
With the exception of mature trees, a total replant was needed. Incorporated in the replant (makeover) were various perennials, shrubs and flowers. Structural features of interest were highlighted using red flowering *Monarda didyma*, *Iris* and *Salix Helvetica*.
